

## **Bell Work - TV 1**

Eventually, I hope to get a set of “classroom clickers,” which will streamline this process. In the meantime, here are the procedures for completing daily Bell Work and starting your hour of TV.

1. When you enter the room, quietly take your assigned seat. The 5 questions will be on the board.
2. Take out a piece of paper. Neatly print the following:  
Your Name  
Today’s Date  
The Hour that you have TV-1 and “TV-1”
3. When the bell rings, I may or may not offer some relevant background info on the video and the video will start playing. THERE IS TO BE NO TALKING DURING THE VIDEO. You will find the answers by *actively* watching the video. If you copy from your neighbor, talk or otherwise disrupt this process, you will lose credit for the assignment.
4. When the video is finished, place your completed paper in the bin marked “Bell Work” for your hour. Please refrain from talking until all work has been handed in.

## **Grading:**

Bell Work is an on-going, daily process for kick-starting your hour of TV-1. It will count as a homework grade and requires you to be in class and on time.

## **Bell Work is worth 10/10.**

If you have an excused absence, the Bell Work will count neither for, nor against you.

If you are tardy, you have 3 choices:

1. If you're not too late, attempt the current Bell Work & take the grade you earn.
2. I will offer a Bell Work makeup session every Fri after school (unless otherwise posted) for the prior week's worth of classes. If you show up and do the work, you have the potential to earn full points.
3. Do nothing; you will get the lowest possible score (4.9).

This work will be coupled with how you participate during class, where you will have the opportunity to lose or gain credit based on how you positively (or negatively) get involved.

-Positive involvement points come from answering questions, helping others, and staying actively involved in the class.

-Negative points come from disregarding rules and procedures, treating others with disrespect, napping during class... you get the picture.
